1. To examine mātauranga Māori to define and restore the cultural context of Te Tai o Aorere and Mohua.
2. To evaluate environmental frameworks from a mātauranga Māori perspective to inform the development of a kaitiakitanga framework.
3. To develop a working relationship with the wider challenge projects to initiate a marine EBM ‘interface’ dialogue process ‘Te Wheke Hononga’.
